What we didn't expect was for the year to put us through some of our most challenging times while also providing us some of our greatest opportunities. The COVID-19 Pandemic that began during Spring Semester completely altered our way of thinking from the most basic of things, such as walking down a hallway, to the most complex of things, such as delivering every lab in a virtual manner. Looking back over the past year, I am amazed at how much we learned about each other, ourselves, and our abilities. Even though many may feel 2020 is not a year to celebrate, Wiregrass students, graduates, faculty, and staff adapted to the world as it changed and created new ways for students to accomplish all of their goals. That adaptation is worth celebrating.

The College is proud to boast that the 2020 Georgia EAGLE Winner, Hannah Hadley, is one of our Adult Education learners. Hannah's story of how she adapted to a family emergency while in high school, causing her to quit school to care for her mother who was ill, was inspirational. Hannah never lost sight of her dream of owning a daycare, and this dream brought her to Wiregrass to work toward her GED®. Her plans are to enroll here at Wiregrass as an Early Childhood Care and Education major. Hannah is the College's first EAGLE winner at the state level.

The College's Marketing and Public Relations team was once again recognized with a National Marketing Award. The team's vision for sharing the multi-facets of all Wiregrass offers was captured by Wiregrass graduates who are the owners of Motion Wave Productions. These Digital Media graduates helped the College receive a gold award for a series of four commercials promoting Wiregrass. Their contribution didn't stop there; they were essential in helping Wiregrass change the College's message through a powerful new commercial series reaching an audience who was on lockdown during the national pandemic.

The old saying "every cloud has a silver lining" was evident when seeing our graduates shine as first responders. Wiregrass graduates like Lauren Clark, RN (2015) served her community in North Georgia as an essential worker in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit. She was one of many who shared their stories of being on the frontlines during the pandemic with us as proud graduates. In addition, I am so proud of the way Wiregrass employees and students answered the call and need for face shields and masks when supplies were backordered. These items were needed to protect employees and students once the College reopened, and our team took the skills they had to design and build what the College needed to open safely. I am also proud of how our traditionally "hands-on" programs shifted gears to ensure that all students were given the tools and support needed to finish their Spring and Summer Semester classes during the most unusual circumstances any of us have lived through. Our IT, Online Services, and Enrollment Management departments worked tirelessly alongside faculty to ensure we helped every student continue with their education.

Even through a pandemic, support for the College's mission continued. Friends of the college donated funds to provide laptops on loan to students who were in need when the college was forced to teach completely online during the lockdown. The Foundation North and South were able to provide over \$90,000 in scholarships and textbooks assistances to students this past year.

Wiregrass is proud of the partnerships and relationships the college has formed in the communities we serve. We thank you for those partnerships. We thank you for your support through your time commitment, in-kind donations, and financial giving. Your involvement in what we do is invaluable to the success of each student.

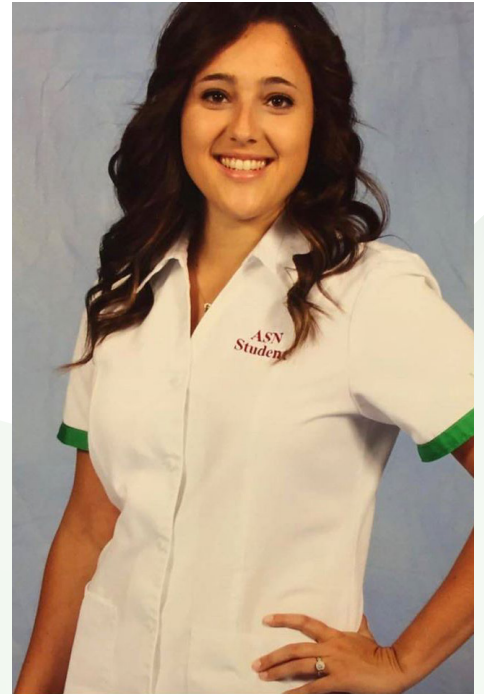
# Wiregrass Grad Turned Essential Worker

## Lauren Clark tells her story

We have all heard stories of essential workers who have risen to the occasion during the national pandemic. Here's a look at how Wiregrass Georgia Technical College and clinical sites, including South Georgia Medical Center, prepared one student for the task.

Lauren Clark of Valdosta, knew even as a little girl she wanted to become a nurse and didn't see herself being anything else. After graduating from Victory Christian School in Valdosta, Lauren enrolled at Wiregrass Georgia Technical College and began work on her core classes for Allied Health. At the time she enrolled at Wiregrass, her plans were to complete her core and then apply to another college to pursue her Associate of Science of Nursing (RN). Lauren's college transfer plans changed when she learned that Wiregrass would be offering an Associate of Science in Nursing Degree just at the perfect time. "I heard about the Wiregrass nursing program that was starting the semester after I finished my core and decided to try it since it was closer to home," shared Lauren. "I'm so glad I did. I also wanted an ASN degree, as opposed to BSN, initially because I knew that an ASN was more hands-on experience and that would be priceless going into my field."

Lauren credits her instructors at Wiregrass for preparing her for her job as a nurse at the Northeast Georgia Medical Center in Gainesville, Georgia. Hall County is ranked fifth in Georgia for highest cases of coronavirus virus. "I could not have made it through without the instructors," Lauren added, "They were tough because they cared and wanted us to be safe and competent nurses when we entered the nursing field. In clinical rotations, they were always seeking out something for us to do, or help with, because they knew that was the best way for us to learn. And, it paid off in the end." Lauren shared that while being in nursing school is hard, and being a nurse is hard, the rewards of knowing you are making a difference in someone's life is worth it. "You will have some of your best and worst days as a nurse, but every bit of it is worth it. From seeing a one-pound preemie go home after months in the NICU, to holding a mother's hand and crying with her as she holds her baby for the first and last time. It is truly an honor to be there for people during the best and worst times of their life," added Lauren.

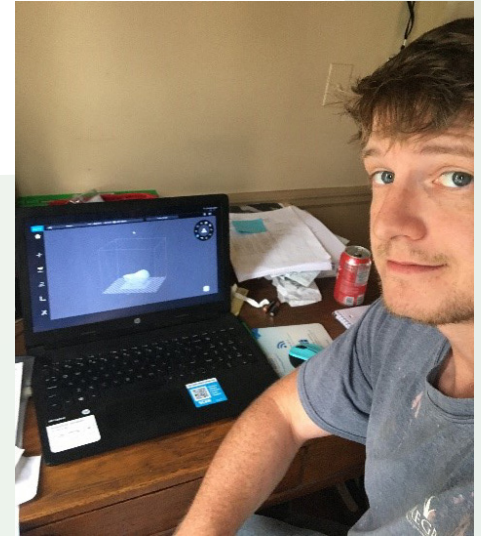
# Wiregrass Engineering Students Addressing Real World Issues Online

When the pandemic hit the world, Wiregrass students found themselves shifting to a virtual environment. Mechatronic students William Hoover, Shawn Lucas, and Tyler Hall decided to take on a real-world issue for their capstone project. Excited to be completing their last course before earning their associate degree in Mechatronics and Engineering, they took a collaborative approach to create a product using real world engineering practices and the same cutting-edge technologies found in local manufacturing facilities. After conducting research and design, cost analysis, prototyping, and time studies, the students were preparing to present their capstone project to a panel of industry experts. Word came that due to COVID-19, colleges within the state would be transitioning to 100% online education for the remainder of the semester. With so many virtual capabilities, such as video-conferencing and other online platforms, the students could easily present their work and complete their capstone project; however, William, Shawn, and Tyler recognized an opportunity to do more.

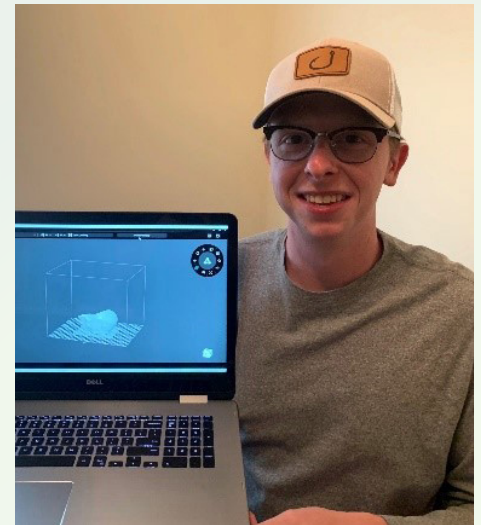
They collaborated with their Wiregrass instructors, Joshua Whittington and Joe Sumner, to design and 3D print respiratory masks. The team conducted several test runs, with each student handling different aspects of the design, cost analysis, and materials needed for a limited mass production run.

William Hoover, who actually purchased his own 3D printer, was able to conduct test prints at his home and share the files with his teammates and instructors. Hoover, who has a Bachelor of Science in Chemistry, says he finds the hands-on aspect of the project "exciting."

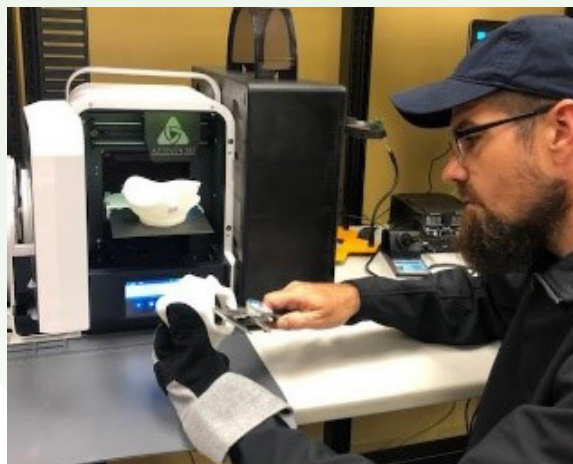
"When the College shifted to 100% online, I knew that I would miss the face-to-face interaction with my peers and instructors," said Hoover. "However, being able to use 3D printing technology to create something that will benefit my fellow students and instructors when the school reopened was exciting." The College returned students to lab work in a limited capacity in June, and the masks were utilized to provide a safe and healthy environment.

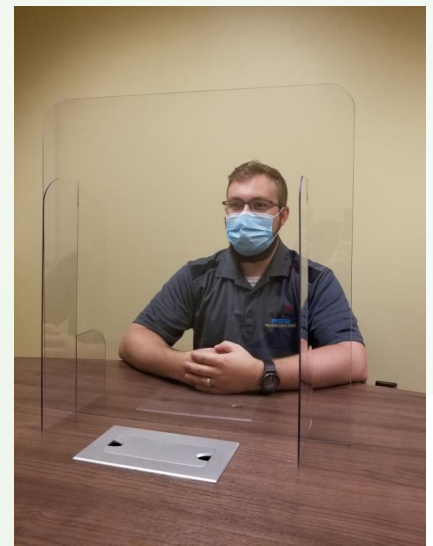

# Wiregrass Tech Instructors Design and Manufacture Protective Shields for College

Technical and Industrial Program Instructors used their program expertise and skills to answer a need for the college. On June 1, the college announced a soft-reopening by appointment only for specific departments to be able to meet with students. For the safety of students and Wiregrass staff, the college attempted to purchase office shield guards prior to this date and learned the protective shields were backordered due to such high demand. The college's slogan for Fall Semester enrollment was, "Be part of the solution," and that's exactly what Wiregrass instructors were able to do.

The instructors produced approximately 75 shields for individual Wiregrass team members for their offices and approximately 20 larger models for various areas such as the Welcome Centers, the Libraries, Bookstores, and Admissions offices on all four campuses.

# Wiregrass Awarded National Marketing Award Thanks to Alumni

Wiregrass was named among the top in the nation in the 2019 Collegiate Advertising program. The Collegiate Advertising Awards (CAA) is an elite program recognizing higher education organizations for excellence in communications, marketing, advertising, and promotions of their schools.

The 2019 CAA program had entries from the United States and Canada representing small community colleges to very large schools and universities. Submissions were reviewed by a national panel of industry experts, with a possibility of 100 total points. Wiregrass' Marketing and Public Relations team received a gold award for a series of four commercials titled, "It's Time for Wiregrass," under the TV/Video Advertising/PSA-Series. The college was one of two technical colleges in the nation to receive an award for the TV/Video category.

"Wiregrass Tech is a college that appeals to many different audiences," shared Lydia Hubert, Wiregrass Director of Marketing and Public Relations. "Because of this, we created a series that speaks directly to each group." The different audiences the commercials speak to include: high school students who are into gaming and high-tech careers, service industry for those who have a passion for helping others, technical and industrial careers, and students who seek to participate in student life activities like Student Veteran Services, Student Government, and SkillsUSA Chapter. "Wiregrass was able to speak also to the different age groups from high school students to young adults to older adults looking to return online," shared Hubert. When planning for commercials, you have .30 seconds to tell your story. With the college appealing to so many various sectors of the population, the four new commercials, perfectly blended, share that story with the message, "it's time for Wiregrass." Another point of pride for the college was who produced the videos. Glenn Boswell and TJ Taylor, owners of Motion Wave Production LLC, a video production company from Valdosta, produced the award-winning commercials, and they are Wiregrass graduates. "It's like a full circle experience for us," shared Hubert. "We were excited to be able to partner with Glenn and TJ with Motion Wave Production to produce these commercials. Both are graduates from our Digital Media Production program, and we are so proud of their success here in South Georgia. We were thrilled to work with them and have them tell our story."

# Wiregrass' Dual Enrollment Program

This year Wiregrass' Dual Enrollment program served over 3,000 high school students and saved parents \$5 million dollars in college tuition. The classes students took ranged from degree level core classes to occupational classes. Twenty-four Wiregrass Dual Enrollment students in the class of 2020 were their school's Valedictorian or Salutatorian, and collectively, these students' college credit hours totaled 556 hours. Some of the dual enrollment students enroll after high school to continue their career path while others use their credit hours earned to further their education at a four-year college or university.

Students get an idea of different career options during the College's STEM & M events held throughout the year at various campuses. Each year, the College invites middle school and high school students to visit the campus and explore program areas while engaging in activities as well as meeting industry partners who hire for those fields. These events serve the College in recruiting for Dual Enrollment and for enrollment after high school.

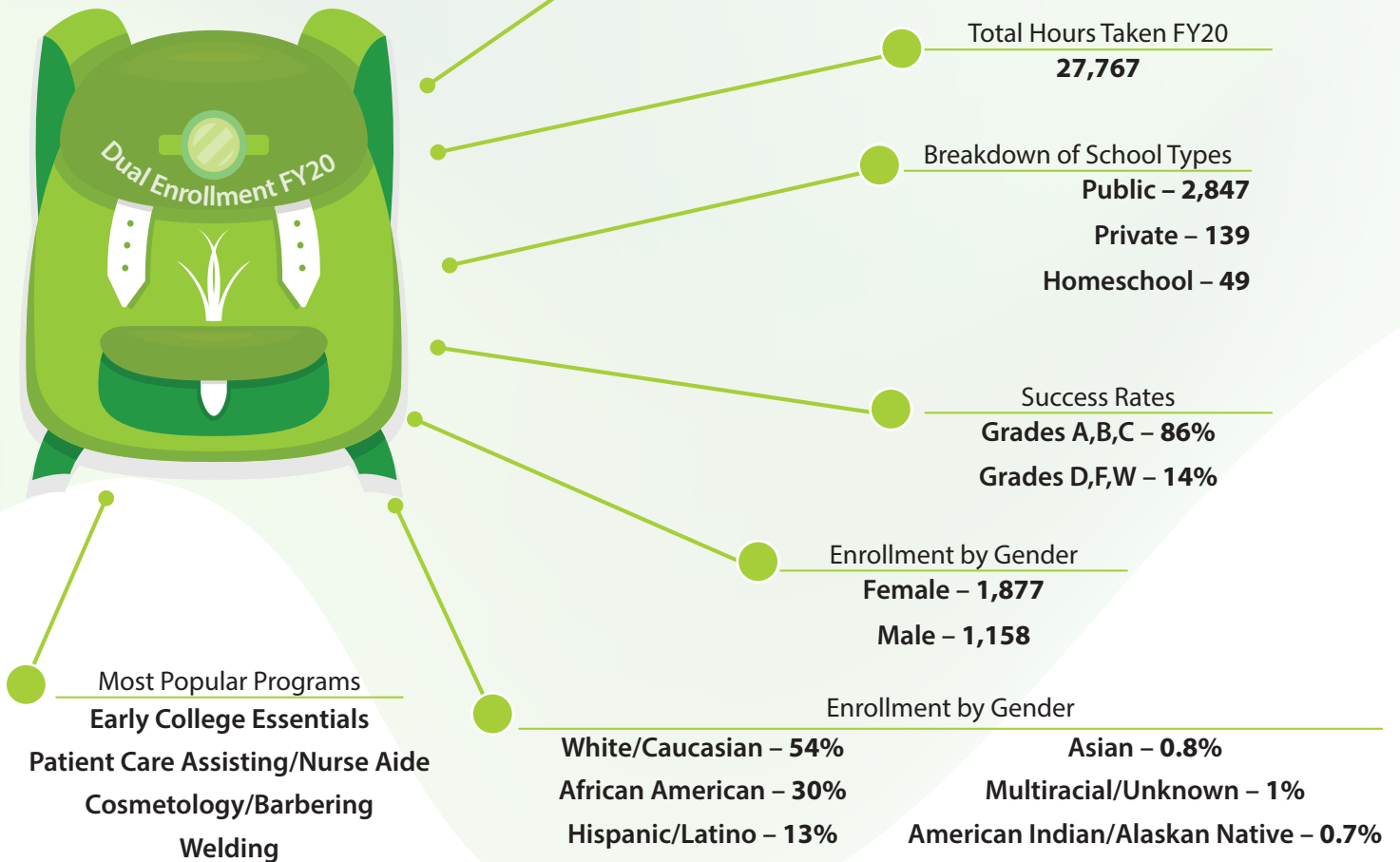

# Wiregrass' Hannah Hadley Named Georgia's 2020 EAGLE Student

What started as a dream of obtaining her GED® brought her to the moment when she heard her name, **Hannah Hadley**, announced as the 2020 Exceptional Adult Georgian in Literacy Education (EAGLE) Student of the Year for Georgia. At the announcement of her name and with a banquet room filled with technical college administrators and staff, including Adult Education leaders from around the state, Hannah was asked once more to share her winning speech, her story. EAGLE is a statewide program that recognizes and rewards excellence among students enrolled in adult education programs. Hadley, a Brooks County native, was announced as Wiregrass' EAGLE Winner in November at a reception sponsored by the Valdosta Lowndes County Chamber of Commerce and ERCO Worldwide.

Hannah was among 26 adult learners who participated in the 27th annual EAGLE Adult Education student of the year program. Hannah, who was selected by a panel of judges from business and education, will receive a full scholarship to the technical college of her choice. In addition, her fees and books will be paid for through a stipend from the Brenda Wise Scholarship Fund, established in 2014 in memory of Brenda Wise, a lifelong supporter of adult education.

When asked what her first thought was when she heard her name, Hannah shared, "When they first announced that I was the 2020 state EAGLE winner, I was elated! I could not believe that me, Hannah, an African American girl from a small town in South Georgia, was now the TCSG Ambassador for the State of Georgia!"

Hannah was nominated by her Adult Education Instructor Toni Lewis. Ms. Lewis shared this about her nominee, "Hannah is a woman of strong character and believes in the power of education." Hannah's speech is her story about her journey to the Adult Education program at Wiregrass. She was a happy teenager and thriving in high school when her mom became ill. She was needed at home and ended up dropping out of school. Being the oldest child, she found herself caring for her younger siblings and her mom. She became a child with adult responsibilities. Her dream of working with children as a career and owning her own daycare seemed lost at the time. Perseverance and hard work have her back on track to fulfill her dreams. Hannah has already completed the first three tests with her GED® and will be taking the fourth and final test soon. After she earns her GED®, she plans to enroll at Wiregrass and major in Early Childhood Care and Education. Her goal is to open her own daycare.

Hannah shared this about the support she has received from the Wiregrass Adult Education instructors, "The Adult Education team has been there with me every step of the way. They answered every question and every phone call. It's a great feeling knowing that you have a team that can back you every step of the way!" Toni Frawley, Wiregrass Adult Education Services Director South, serves as the college's EAGLE Coordinator.

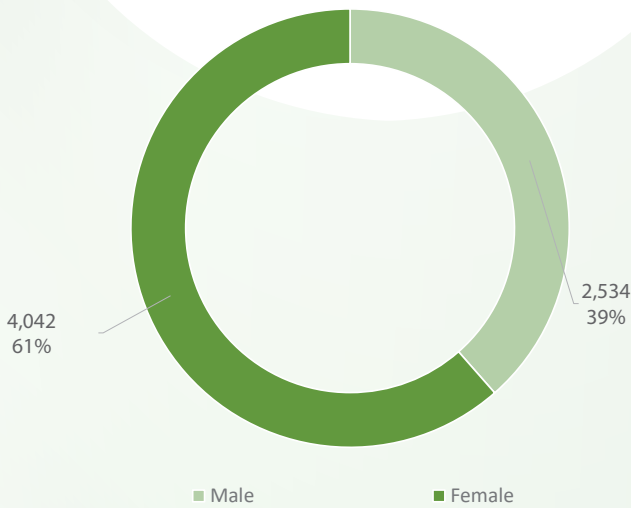

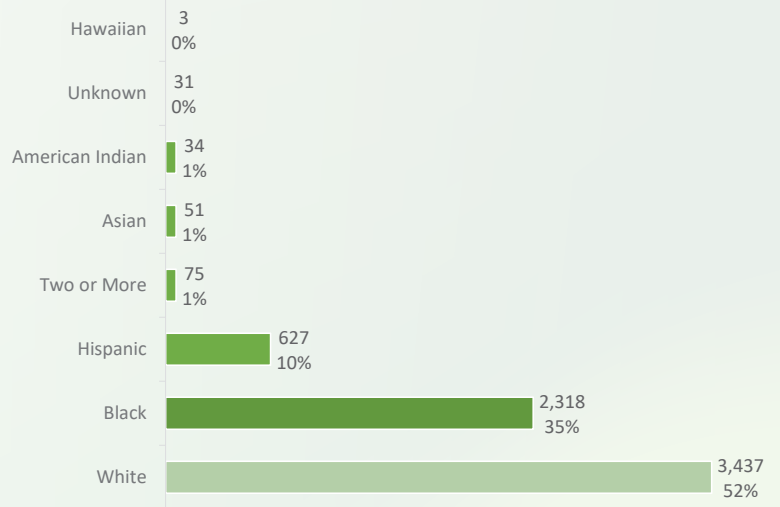

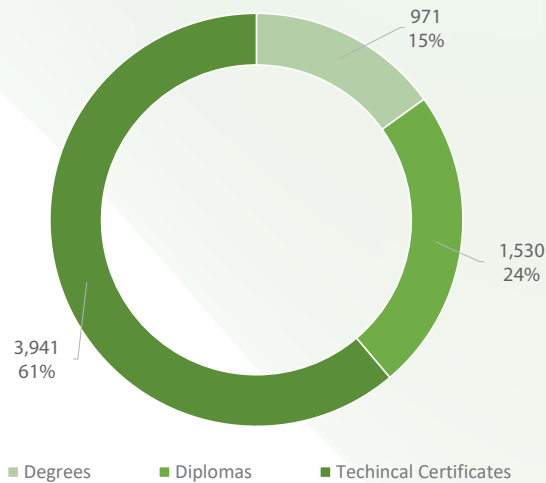


**Enrollment by Gender**

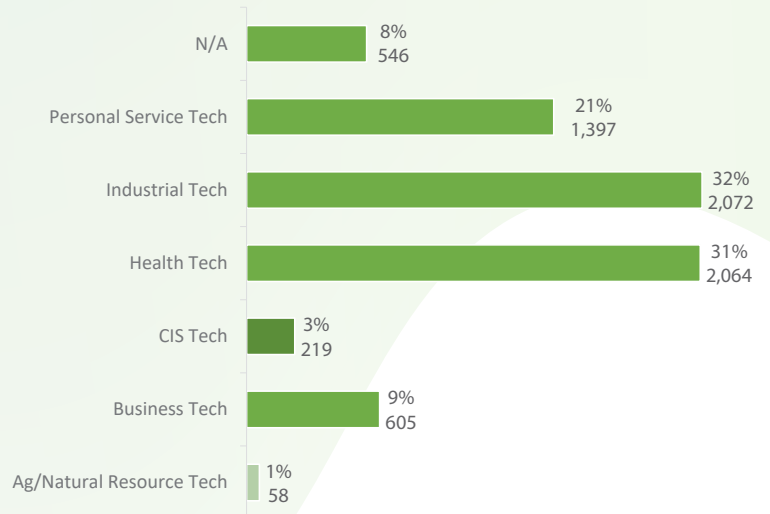


**Enrollment by Race**

**Enrollment by Program Type**

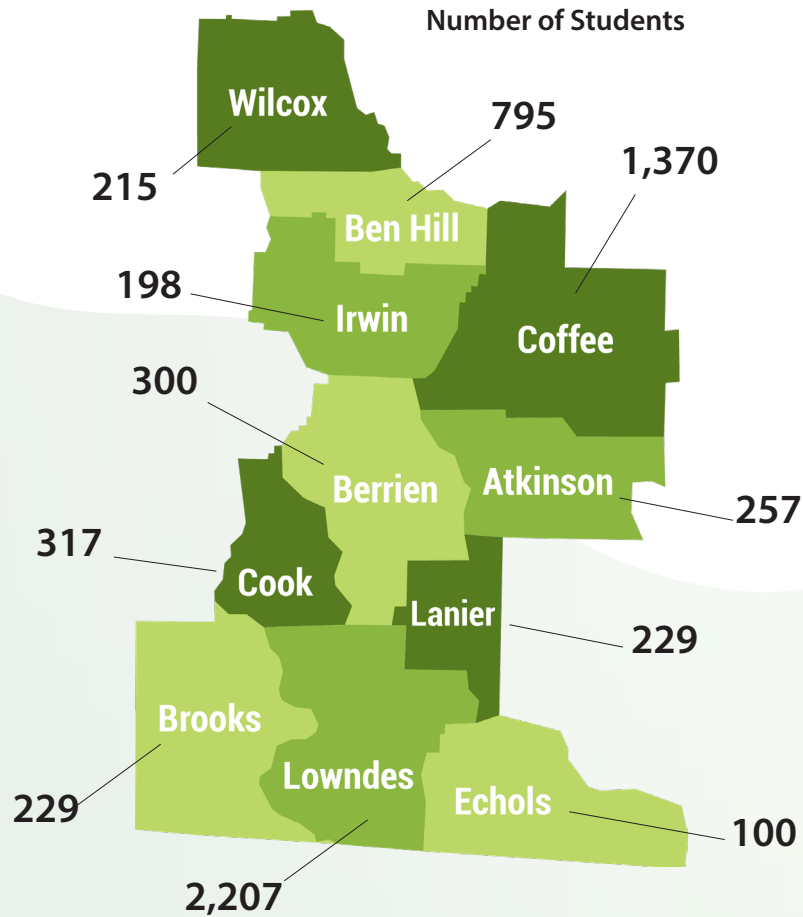


**Enrollment by Program Area**

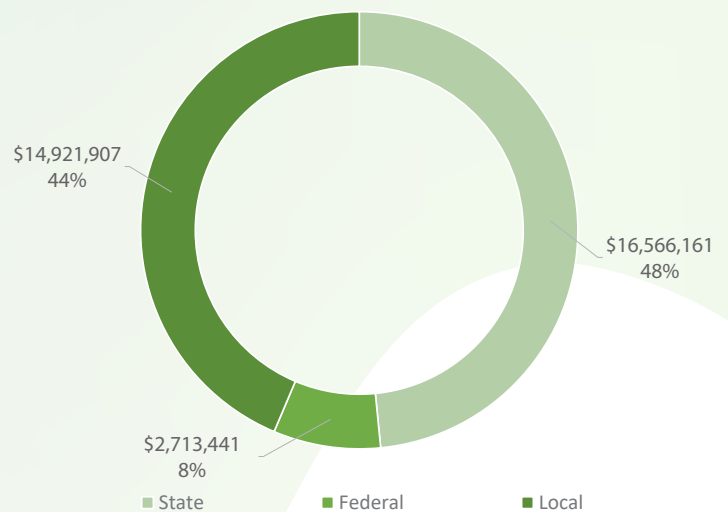
