Dual Achievement offers qualified students an alternate path to high school graduation. Students choose to simultaneously earn a high school diploma and a Wiregrass degree, diploma or two (2) Technical Certificates of Credit in a specific career pathway.

Students interested in Dual Achievement must have earned 6 of the 9 high school courses listed below from their home high school, and then transfer to the Central Georgia Technical College Academy to complete any remaining high school requirements. Technical College requirements can be taken on-campus or online through Wiregrass Georgia Technical College.

High School Requirements:

- 2 English/Language Arts
- 2 Maths
- 2 Sciences
- 2 Social Studies
- 1 Health/PE

Technical College Requirements:

- Any one Wiregrass Associates Degree
- Any one Wiregrass Diploma
- Or any approved paired Technical Certificates of Credit (TCC) in the following areas:

 - Aerospace
 - Air Conditioning
 - Automotive Technology
 - Barbering
 - Business
 - Cosmetology
 - Criminal Justice
 - Culinary Arts
 - Design and Media Production
 - Diesel Technology
 - Early Childhood Care & Education

 - Nursing
 - Precision Machining and Manufacturing
 - Welding

Dual Achievement vs Accelerated Career

- Dual Achievement students transfer from their home high school to the Central Georgia Technical College Academy and will graduate from there once all requirements are met.
- High School courses required are not tied to specific courses, and no EOC testing is required.
- Dual Achievement offers students more TCC options to be used for HS graduation.
