



Articulation Agreement
Kaplan University
And
Wiregrass Georgia Technical College

General Information:

The cooperative agreement between Kaplan University (KU) and Wiregrass Georgia Technical College (WGTC) provides students an opportunity to continue their education, and obtain a bachelor's degree from Kaplan University, after completion of an Associate of Applied Science degree, diploma, or technical certificate at Wiregrass Georgia Technical College.

Guidelines for Advanced Start Bachelor's Completion Programs:

- a) To be eligible for application to an advanced start bachelor's program at KU, the student must submit proof of having been awarded an associate's degree from Wiregrass Georgia Technical College.
- b) Students who have completed an associate's degree program consisting of a minimum of 60 semester credit hours, or 90 quarter credit hours, will be eligible for a block credit transfer of up to 90-quarter credits, junior status, and acceptance into KU's "advanced Start" baccalaureate option.
- c) Students must fulfill KU residency requirements by completing no less than 25% of their program requirements with Kaplan University. This includes a minimum of 50% of the major requirements, including a capstone course. Credit earned through a combination of Transfer Credit, Challenge Credit, or Experiential Credit will not exceed 75% of total credits required for graduation. Terms:

- 1) Due to the articulation agreement with Wiregrass Georgia Technical College, Kaplan University will extend the following discount to WGTC alumni and employees simultaneous with the date of this fully executed agreement:
 - a) Wiregrass Georgia Technical College alumni and employees will receive a ten percent (10%) discount on their Kaplan University tuition (this applies to tuition only). WGTC alumni must inform KU Admissions Directors about their affiliation to receive the discount upon applying to the college.
 - b) Kaplan University will extend to WGTC alumni and employees all of its online certificates, undergraduate, and graduate programs, as offered.
- 2) Admission criteria, academia, and other requirements will be subject to the applicable Kaplan University catalog at the time of the students' admission into KU.
